

ASSISTANT PROFESSOR

The Department of Mathematics (<http://www.math.ryerson.ca/>) at Ryerson University invites applications for a tenure-track faculty position in Mathematics at the Assistant Professor level to commence on August 1, 2011. The position is subject to final budgetary approval.

Applicants should have research interests in one of the three research groups in the department: Biomathematics and Fluids, Financial Mathematics, and Graphs at Ryerson. A Ph.D. degree and evidence of excellence in research and teaching are required. Successful applicants are expected to maintain an active program of research, to attract external research funding, to attract and supervise graduate students, and to participate in undergraduate and graduate teaching.

Applications should include a curriculum vitae, a cover letter that indicates to which of the three groups their research is most related, research and teaching statements, up to three selected reprints/preprints and the names of three individuals who could be contacted for reference letters. Only those candidates selected for the short-list of consideration will be contacted for reference letters. Please submit all documents and names of references electronically to mathjob@ryerson.ca

Closing date for receipt of applications is **November 1, 2010**. All positions will be subject to budgetary approval. Note that only the short-listed candidates will be contacted for further processing of the applications (including interviews).
