

DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS & STATISTICS

The Department of Mathematics & Statistics at The University of Winnipeg invites outstanding candidates to apply for a continuing appointment in mathematics at the rank of Instructor. Candidates must hold a Masters degree in mathematics, but a PhD is preferred. The primary focus of the successful candidate will be the teaching of mathematics courses at all undergraduate levels, to a wide variety of students. This will primarily include teaching pre-university math courses and math content courses for pre-service elementary and middle years teachers, but will also include teaching courses for business, science, and upper-level mathematics students. The successful candidate must have a demonstrated record of teaching excellence, must be committed to the continued success of the department and its programs, and will be expected to work collegially on departmental committees. Subject to budgetary approval, this appointment will commence on July 1, 2016. Salary levels will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

The selection committee will begin reviewing applications on May 2, 2016 and will continue until the position is filled; full consideration is assured for applications received by May 1, 2016. Interested candidates should submit a cover letter, curriculum vitae, a teaching statement and evidence of excellent teaching in the form of student evaluations, as well as arrange to have three letters of reference that address the candidate's teaching effectiveness sent directly to Dr. Ross Stokke, Chair.
