Appointments at the rank of Lecturer may be renewed annually to a maximum of five years. In the fifth year of service, Lecturers shall be reviewed and a recommendation made with respect to promotion to the rank of Senior Lecturer.

We seek candidates who have a record of excellent teaching and who have the intellectual curiosity to pursue novel and innovative methods of thinking and teaching, and who are interested in establishing a long-term teaching career with the Department.

Candidates should have an advanced degree in mathematics. Evidence of excellence in teaching is necessary.

The Department wants to reinforce existing areas of teaching coverage in mathematics and expand into new areas. Responsibilities include undergraduate teaching, managing teaching assistants, developing course materials, and curriculum development. In addition, each faculty member has some responsibility for student recruitment and departmental administration.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
