

## Lecturer - Department of Mathematics

The Department of Mathematics, University of Toronto invites applications for two teaching-stream positions at the rank of Lecturer in Mathematics. The expected start date of the two appointments is July 1, 2013.

Applicants must have earned a Ph.D. in Mathematics and significant experience in teaching. Candidates with teaching expertise in any area of Mathematics may apply. The successful candidates will be expected to participate in formulating new curricular initiatives and designing innovative approaches to the teaching of Mathematics. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Appointments at the rank of Lecturer may be renewed annually to a maximum of five years. On the fifth year of service, Lecturers shall be reviewed and a recommendation made with respect to the rank of Senior Lecturer. Evidence of excellence in teaching is required.

All qualified candidates are invited to apply through the MathJobs (<u>https://www.mathjobs.org/jobs</u>) website. Applications should include a cover letter, curriculum vitae, and three reference letters, including one which primarily addresses the candidate's teaching.
