The successful candidate must hold a PhD in Statistics or a closely related field. The candidate should show a strong commitment to excellence in both undergraduate teaching and research. The primary teaching responsibilities of the successful candidate will be teaching courses at the undergraduate level in Statistics; the successful candidate will be expected to have an active research program and to be successful in obtaining external grants.

Applications should include a cover letter, a curriculum vitae, a statement of teaching interests and philosophy, a statement of research interests, copies of up to three recent publications and the contact information for three references.
