Candidates should have a Ph.D. in Applied Mathematics, Operations Research, Data Science, Mathematics or related. The successful candidate will teach introductory mathematics courses and operations research. Demonstrated evidence of high-quality teaching at the university level in classroom and virtual environments, curating and/or producing digital learning resources and assessments using a range of tools and technologies from course design through to delivery will be an asset.

A research agenda in areas aligned with economics, finance, data analytics, operations research, management, other social sciences is an asset. Service work may include course coordination and assistance with creation of new courses.
