

Probationary Tenure Track, Assistant Professor – Mathematics and Analytics

The successful candidate will have or be near completion of a Ph.D. in Applied Mathematics, Operations Research, Data Science, or related field. A commitment to excellence in undergraduate teaching is required, and the ideal candidate has a track-record of effective teaching at the undergraduate level. The successful candidate will develop and teach several introductory mathematics courses, as well as sophomore-level and/or senior courses in Analytics and Decision Sciences (ADS). The applicant is expected to have an active research agenda in any of the mathematical sciences. Service work will include course coordination and assistance with creation of new courses. The ideal candidate will have expertise with the computational tools utilized in ADS courses, including Excel, Python, and/or R.

A commitment to excellence in undergraduate teaching is expected. Demonstrated evidence of high-quality teaching at the university level in classroom, community and/or virtual environments, experiential learning, curating and/or producing digital learning resources and assessments using a range of tools and technologies from course design through to delivery will be an asset.

Salary shall be in accordance with the King's University College Faculty Association (KUCFA) Collective Agreement.

Applications should include the following, packaged into a single PDF.

Cover letter that explains how the candidate's qualifications align with the job description and the department, as well as how they will contribute to equity, diversity, inclusion, and decolonization;
curriculum vitae;

3) short statements of research and teaching interests;

4) evidence of effective and innovative teaching, including teaching evaluations;

5) copies of a maximum of three publications or dissertation chapters; links to other papers

6) the names and contact details of three academic referees (we will request letters for only those candidates who are considered for the interview stage)
